
The Kingdom's Delegation to the G20 Leaders' Summit Headed by Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman

Crown Prince Inaugurates King Salman Energy Park project (SPARK)



Saudi Arabia's Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman on Monday inaugurated the King Salman Energy Park (SPARK), located in the Kingdom's Eastern Province.

SPARK is a 50 km² energy city mega-project and will unite approximately 300 industrial and service facilities, which will position Saudi Arabia as a global energy, industrial and technology hub.

Saudi Aramco will develop, operate, manage and maintain the project's infrastructure in partnership with the Saudi Authority for Industrial Cities and Technology Zones (MODON).

SPARK's role in enabling localization within the Kingdom's energy supply chain aligns with the strategic goals of Saudi Aramco's In-Kingdom Total Value Add (IKTVA) program.

IKTVA was launched by Saudi Aramco in December 2015 with the aim of benefiting from relationships with manufacturers, suppliers, and service providers, to enhance the company's goals and raise the level of local content to about 70% by the end of 2021.

The energy park, located between Dammam and Al-Ahsa, will be developed in three phases. The project will cover an area of 50 km². The first phase of the development will cover 12 km² and will be completed by 2021.

During the groundbreaking ceremony, Minister of Energy, Industry and Mineral Resources and Saudi Aramco chairman, Khalid A. Al-Falih, announced that SPARK will be a Special Economic Zone, where tenants will benefit from regulatory, fiscal and non-fiscal support.

SPARK has already attracted investments from foreign and local companies to produce and manufacture goods and services in the Kingdom's energy sector.

The investment in the first phase of the project is expected to be around \$1.6 billion.

When operational, SPARK is estimated to contribute more than \$6 billion to the Kingdom's GDP annually and create up to 100,000 direct and indirect jobs. Twelve agreements and memorandums of understanding were signed on Monday for land leasing and the construction of investment partnerships in the city, worth SR 1.2 billion, between Saudi Aramco and the city's board of directors and some international and local companies, including Schlumberger, Halliburton and Baker Hughes GE, Halliburton, Oilfields Supply Center, Saudi Information Technology Company, Al-Rushaid Group, and many more.

The first phase will target more than 120 investments.

SPARK will target five areas; the first one focuses on industrial manufacturing and will include electrical equipment,

liquids and chemicals, metal formation, and other industrial services. The other areas include a dry port area with an annual capacity of 8 million metric tons, a Saudi Aramco drilling and well-maintenance area, a specialized training area that can accommodate 10 training centers aimed at developing skills and building the capacity of Saudi national cadres, and finally, a residential, commercial and recreational area.

Saudi Arabia pledges \$113m to support Sahel countries

Saudi Arabia's Minister of State for African Affairs Ahmed bin Abdul Aziz Kattan announced a donation of \$113.7 million to support Sahel countries. Kattan revealed the donation during the opening ceremony of the Coordination Conference of G5 Sahel Partners and Funders for Financing of Priority Investment Programme (PIP) for (2019-2021) in the Mauritanian capital Nouakchott.

The G5 Sahel comprises Mali, Mauritania, Niger, Burkina Faso and Chad. He said King Salman had ordered the money to support these five countries, adding that half this amount would be allocated to support priority investments in the Sahel.



Two Saudi-designed satellites launch into space

Saudi Arabia launched two Saudi-designed satellites into space for aerial surveying on 7 December from China.

The two earth-observation satellites that were developed by the King Abdulaziz City for Science and Technology (KACST) were launched from Jiuguan Satellite Launch Center. The satellites will be used to provide high-resolution images of the planet's surface from low earth orbits.

Ambassadors' Meeting

H.E. Abdulrahman Alahmed the Saudi ambassador to the Kingdom of Belgium and the Duchy of Luxembourg, headed on December 11, 2018, the regular meeting of ambassadors and heads of missions accredited to Belgium, Luxembourg, European Union and NATO.
