SAUDI ARABIA HOSTS MILLIONS OF PILGRIMS DURING HAJJ 2019

Under the guidance of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques, King Salman, The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia successfully served nearly two and a half million pilgrims - more than 67 thousand of them coming from Europe - during this year's annual Hajj pilgrimage.

Through resolute leadership and relentless preparation, Saudi Arabia was able to manage the massive amount of people coming to the Holy City of Mecca, as well as providing them with all the assistance and infrastructure to perform Hajj with all comfort and ease.

Qiddiya: Saudi Arabia's entertainment, sports and culture giga project

Saudi Arabia is making progress with the giga-projects announced in the scope of its Vision 2030. The Qiddiya project aims to develop a destination that can be a hub for entertainment, creativity, sociability, and opportunity. Qiddiya will be the world's biggest entertainment supercity and is expected to create over 25 thousand new job posts by 2030.

The first phase of Qiddiya will be finished in 2023 and will include a Six Flags theme park, a water park, a motorsports center and sports and performing arts venues. This first phase will consist of over 45 projects and 300 activities, such as racetracks and roller coasters. All these initiatives are creating new employment opportunities for Saudi youth in exciting new sectors.

IMF publishes encouraging assessment of Saudi economy

The Executive Board of the International Monetary Fund concluded in July the process of bilateral consultation with Saudi Arabia. As is usual, IMF experts visited the Kingdom to collect economic and financial information, as well as discuss the country's economic developments and policies with national officials.

Based on their report, IMF Executive Directors praised Saudi leadership for the progress in the implementation of the economic and social improvements of Vision 2030. They noted that reforms are already producing concrete results and that the forecast for the economy is positive.

The IMF pointed out that following the reforms envisioned in Vision 2030 will be vital in fostering sustainable economic growth, creating jobs, and achieving the Kingdom's goals.





ment Company initiated an international scholarship program that has already provided 60 scholarships for Bachelor's and Master's degrees. The program aims to educate and train Saudi students at the most prestigious universities in the world, giving these students an opportunity to learn a new profession and bring back valuable skills when they return to the Kingdom.

In July, the project has achieved another milestone: the Qiddiya Investment Company has started the process to build a 2.000-square meter office building on the Qiddiya site, just 30 minutes from Riyadh. The offices will be designed in line with Qiddiya's environmental conscience and sustainability principles and will serve as a temporary workspace while the supercity is under construction.

Saudi Arabia announces the world's first long-range hyperloop test track

Saudi Vision 2030 is taking the Kingdom closer to becoming a hotbed for innovative technology. The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is about to become the testing ground for the revolutionary hyperloop technology. The King Abdullah Economic City Authority and Virgin Hyperloop One announced the signing of a development partnership to build what will be the world's first long-range test track for the technology that will change transportation all around the world.

"With Vision 2030, the Kingdom has demonstrated bold leadership to advance game-changing solutions. A hyperloop system could help enable Saudi Arabia to become a global transportation powerhouse, nurture the nation's innovation and entrepreneurial culture, and grow an innovative knowledge workforce," said Jay Walder, CEO, Virgin Hyperloop One. The test and certification track will be 37km long and will be built just outside the Red Sea port of Jeddah, in the King Abdullah Economic City.



The world-class hyperloop center of excellence will include a research center and a hyperloop manufacturing facility. It will generate over 6000 jobs in the technology sector and allow the development of the local industry to produce hyperloop components.

The hyperloop concept involves a pressurized pod with a magnetically-suspended vehicle carrying passengers or cargo up to 10 times faster than current rail. By hyperloop, the commute from Riyadh to Jeddah - that currently takes 10 hours by car - will be possible in less than 80 minutes.

This groundbreaking technology is equivalent to the combination of traveling at the speed of a jet plane with the energy efficiency of a train.

"Having hyperloop at King Abdullah Economic City is going to act as a catalyst for a Saudi Silicon Valley effect and galvanize our software development, high technology research, and manufacturing industries," Secretary-General of the ECA, Mohanud A. Helal said.
